<p>Roadside Marijuana Breathalyzer Oklahoma Representative Scott Fetgatter</p> <p>In 2020, Rep. Fetgatter, advocated for a Roadside Marijuana Breathalyzer pilot program in Oklahoma House Bill 4161. The roadside test would not be admissible in court, but the pilot project would help inform future policy decisions. The Hound Labs device measures time from ingestion, with NHTSA’s guidance for peak impairment levels. Rep. <p>DADSS (or other) In-car Technology – 2 speakers: technology & auto industry</p> <p>The infrastructure bill that just passed in Congress includes safety standards that would require smart technology in new cars to prevent drunk driving. Once the bill is signed, NHTSA will have 3 years to evaluate these passive technologies, then automakers would have 2-3 years to implement the new standards. DADSS has been exploring breath and touch systems since 2008. The program brings together the Automobile Coalition for Traffic Safety and the National Highway Safety Administration.</p> <p>Target Audience: Prevention / Advocacy</p>	<p>Extract-Ed, LLC Ryan Hutton</p> <p>Everything You Need to Know About Cannabis- The nationwide trend of legalizing marijuana for medical and recreational use has placed officers in an anomalous position.
