detect THC - the psychoactive component of marijuana that causes impairment using breath samples. Breath testing for THC would allow employers and law enforcement to identify recent marijuana use that better aligns with impairment. Cannabix devices are in the advanced prototype and pre-clinical testing stage.

DADSS (or other) In-car Technology – 2 speakers: technology & auto industry

The infrastructure bill that just passed in Congress includes safety standards that would require smart technology in new cars to prevent drunk driving. Once the bill is signed, NHTSA will have 3 years to evaluate these passive technologies, then automakers would have 2-3 years to implement the new standards. DADSS has been exploring breath and touch systems since 2008. The program brings together the Automobile Coalition for Traffic Safety and the National Highway Safety Administration.
