**Cannabis and DUID Investigations** (60 minutes) (April 9, 2021) Joseph Jones, System Director at North Louisiana Criminalistics Laboratory

Marijuana is the most common illicit substance consumed by persons who report driving after drug use.¹ Epidemiological research also indicates that cannabis is the most prevalent illicit drug detected in fatally injured drivers and motor vehicle crash victims. These cases are frequent yet overwhelming to a prosecutor when they begin putting together all the elements necessary to build a successful case in the courtroom. In these presentations, follow along with a certified Drug Recognition Expert and a Forensic Toxicologist through an actual DUID investigation involving cannabis. Specific discussion will involve the complexity of building a case from identifying the initial start time of drug use through the forensic specimen collection often occurring at the conclusion of the investigation. The conversation is intentionally casual and intended for new and experienced prosecutors.

This seminar is geared to highlight the challenges of this testing for public crime labs, law enforcement agencies, and attorneys, attendees will learn the impact of the federal Hemp Farming Act of 2018 and evolving state regulations, which has increased demand for cannabinoid quantitation; complexity of developing testing for different matrices to analytically determine the concentration and weight of delta-9-THC in evidentiary items such as botanicals as well as other sample types that are increasingly being used as carriers for cannabinoids; and expanded capabilities offered by NMS Labs to report beyond delta-9-THC to include the potency of other cannabinoid compounds including delta-8-THC, delta-9-THC, THCA and total THC, as well as CBD.

## The Rise and Fall of the Prohibition on Cannabis & Its Impact on Driving Under the Influence

Marijuana/Cannabis impairment is a challenging new arena for prosecutors to tackle. Marijuana is legal, but driving under the influence of it is not. Prosecutors and officers need skills to understand what a marijuana impairment DUI looks like. This course is designed to raise a prosecutor's competency to ensure that they understand what a high person looks like, what to expect on the FSTs, and what to look for in the report to see if there is sufficient evidence for filing. This presentation also aids a prosecutor in discussing this evidence with a jury. Helping them understand and convey it will enable them to better

prosecute these DUI cases. This presentation teaches prosecutors about the effects of a class of commonly used and recently regulated drug: cannabis/marijuana. This presentation assists prosecutors in bettering their abilities to prosecute and evaluate the strength and weaknesses of these cases. Presenters discuss typical manners of ingestion as well as effects of using marijuana. This presentation discusses how driving is affected by the use of marijuana and best practices in prosecuting a marijuana DUI. "DU-High" - Taking a Closer Look at Marijuana Impaired Driving (60 minutes) (January 2019) Chuck Hayes, International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP), Drug Evaluation and Classification Program (DECP) Western Region Project Manager

Marijuana is the most widely used illicit drug. It is also the most frequently detected non-alcohol substance in drivers in the United States and has been shown to impair driving performance and increase crash risk. However, the exact level of Delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol (THC), the main psychoactive chemical in marijuana, and its relationship to driving impairment is unknown and often debated. In this session, information is presented from two major cannabis and driving studies that identified the most frequent indicators of impairment in cannabis-impaired drivers with varying blood levels of THC. Information is also provided on which cognitive, perceptual, and psychomotor tasks are most often affected by THC. How those various indicators can be used to assist in identifying impairment using the psychophysical tests officers receive in the SFST, Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE), and the Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) training is presented.

This presentation covers the occurrence of when a person drives a motor vehicle when his or her ability to do so is impaired by the cognitive or psychomotor effects of tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) in cannabis. A cannabis-positive driver is someone who drives a motor vehicle with detectable levels of THC in their blood, oral fluid, or urine (depending on jurisdiction). His or her driving may not necessarily be impaired by cannabis, for example, if the THC level reflects cannabis use that occurred in the past but is still detectable. Driving under the influence of cannabis, depending on the jurisdiction, may refer to a driver who has a measured reduction in cognitive or psycho motor skills, more than a defined level of THC in the blood, oral fluid, or urine
