MADD History

On September 5, 1980, Mothers Against Drunk Drivers (MADD) was incorporated and the mission as stated in its Articles of Incorporation were "To aid the victims of crimes performed by individuals driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs, to aid the families of such victims and to increase public awareness of the problem of drinking and drugged driving.

Campaign to Eliminate Drunk Driving Initiated in 2006

- <u>Support our heroes</u>: Support high-visibility law enforcement to catch drunk drivers and discourage others from driving drunk.
- <u>Sober to start:</u> Require ignition interlock devices, or in-car breathalyzers, for all drunk drivers, to prove they are sober before their car will start.
- <u>Secure the future:</u> Support the development of technology to determine automatically whether or not the driver is above the legal limit of .08 and failing to operate if the driver is drunk.
- <u>Public Support:</u> Its everybody's responsibility to eliminate drunk driving. Reengage the public in the fight against impaired driving.

We are currently trending in the wrong directions!

- 13,384 Alcohol-impaired traffic fatalities in 2021
- 14% increase in alcohol related impaired driving crashes in 2021
- 2021 42,939 traffic fatalities 9% increase
- 31% of total traffic fatalities are alcoholimpaired related – leading cause followed closely behind by speeding
- 37 Alcohol-impaired traffic fatalities per day
- An alcohol-impaired fatal crash every 39 minutes
- Drugged Driving we don't know what we don't know





A 38-year history by the numbers


Drunk Driving Deaths Increased 14% in 2021

MADD National selects Trooper First Class Lyle German as our Officer of the Month for February 2022. Trooper German is with the Maryland State Police assigned to the Barrack N - Rockville.

Trooper First Class Lyle German remains committed to removing impoired drivers from Maryland's roadways. In 2021, Trooper German removed over 45 impaired individuals from Maryland's roads, accounting for approximately 17% of the total DUI arrests at the Rockville Berrack.

In December 2021, Trooper German accomplished a significant milestone in his 5-year career by making his 200th DUI arrest. His proficiency in identifying impaired drivers has led him to make an arrest on 1 out of every 20 traffic stops he makes. Trooper German was also earned a position on the Montgomery County Holiday...

Kansas Highway Patrol Leads the way in Impaired Driving Prevention Guest Authors: Technical Troopers Carson Nuss and Mark Crump

The Kansas Highway Patrol was officially organized in 1937 with the goal to reduce crashes through enforcement of traffic laws. The fleet of 4 motorcycles and 31 patrol cars were used by the first 45 Troopers. From the inception of those early days to today, the goals for the Kansas Highway Patrol have not changed. The Kansas Highway Patrol has grown to over 400 Troopers with a fleet program that ranks amongst the best in the nation. Through the years of growth, the Patrol has stayed true to its roots and continues to find ways to reduce crashes and save lives on our roadways. Understanding what was causing most fatal crashes, the Patrol took aggressive and monumental steps to stop the illegal and dangerous act of driving under the influence by realizing that a specialized unit would be needed to not only combat the DUI problem, but also train all law enforcement across the State how to recognize the impaired driver. With the advancement of testing drivers with breath devices, this specialized unit gained its name - The Breath Alcohol Unit. As training continued and advancements in Drug Recognition Experts (DRE's) became a larger role, the unit became the Drug and Alcohol

MADD's current Umbrella Agreement with NHTSA was approved and initiated on April 1, 2020, for \$1.2 Million.

- Roll Call Video Series Project
- ✓ Approved on April 1,2020 as a 12-month agreement
- ✓ Law Enforcement Impaired Driving Roll Call Video completed in 2021
- MADD/NHTSA Regional Impaired Driving Law Enforcement Summits
- ✓ Approved on April 1, 2020, as a 24-month agreement
- One day summits to be held in each of the ten NHTSA Regions
- ✓ Has been due to COVID-19 Pandemic
- Law Enforcement Engagement Initiative
- ✓ Approved on September 30, 2021, as a 24-month agreement
- ✓ Funding for MADD's Law Enforcement committee to meet and develop a toolkit for law enforcement to address impaired driving

MADD Roll Call Video Series NHTSA/MADD Cooperative Agreement Project

- Again, Produced under a NHTSA Cooperative Agreement Grant
- The Series contains the main Roll Call Video for law enforcement 10 minutes in length
- Four other short law enforcement related videos and four victim story videos.
- The objectives of this project include, but are not limited to, the following:
- Produce, disseminate and promote a law enforcement impaired driving roll call briefing video;
- 2. increase the enforcement of impaired driving laws; and
- reduce the number of crashes, injuries, and fatalities related to impaired driving.

Project Details

- A key aspect of this video series was the victims' stories.
- MADD received 30 victim story submissions for consideration.
- 17 victim stories (including 2 law enforcement victim stories) were chosen to be filmed.
- 15 total law enforcement officer interviews were conducted for the project.
- MADD coordinated three filming trips across the country made by Texas Pictures to film and interview 36 different individuals to include law enforcement officers.
- This Cooperative Agreement Project was initiated on April 1, 2020 and was completed on April 1, 2021.



Video Series Content – Five Law Enforcement Training Videos

- Session 1: We Can Stop This (Main Roll Call Video) The main Roll Call Video is 10:14 in length.
- **Session 2: Murder in Progress –** This is a short 3:45 video featuring 9 law enforcement officers from 7 states addressing how impaired driving is a violent crime in progress.
- **Session 3: Elephant in the Room –** In this video of 6:26, 10 veteran and experienced law enforcement officers address the typically unspoken deterrents to aggressively enforcing impaired driving laws.
- **Session 4: MADD and Law Enforcement -** In this short 3:53 video, 8 law enforcement officers from 7 states talk about the value of the MADD/Law Enforcement partnership.
- Session 5: Hutton's Stop This is a short 3:21 video of a Missouri State Trooper telling
 his story of making one final round at the end of his shift to find an impaired driver.




